Semester 1 2024 exams run from **Monday, 10th June to Friday, 21st June 2024.**

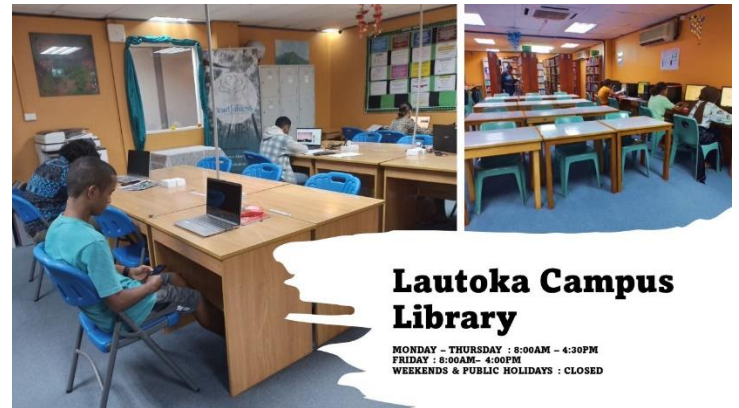

4 PREPARATION TIPS FOR EXAMS

Regional students at other campuses should contact their Campus Admin Office or their Student Administrative Services office(r) for their examination venue.

Note that the exam venue shown on your personal timetable is only for **Laucala Campus** students.

- Be on time. You should be at the exam venue at least 1/2 an hour before each exam starts
- Make sure you appear at the correct time and date for your examination
- Make sure you have a USP photo **ID**
Other materials not allowed into the exam venue:
- **DO NOT** bring any valuables or bags to the examination venue because USP is not responsible for this
- Do not bring any mobile phone, laptop, tablet or any other electronic device into the examination venue
- If you are doing an online **Final Test**, ensure that the keyboard and desktop are working well.

There are different types of databases:

- Full-text – contains the full-text of journal articles etc., that you are often able to download as PDF.
- Indexing and abstracting – offer details about the item but not the full-text.
- Audio-visual – allow you to download or stream images, video, or sound.



JSTOR

JSTOR database provides access to more than 12 million academic journal articles, books, and primary sources in 75 disciplines.

Explore millions of high-quality primary sources and images from around the world, including artworks, maps, photographs, and more.

ACADEMIC VIDEO ONLINE

Academic Video Online contains over 70,000 videos, ranging from historical footage, news reels, documentaries, and feature films. Many of these films are about Pacific places and people, such as Vilsoni Hereniko's *The Land Has Eyes* (2004). These films make great teaching tools, and can also be used to support research papers and assignments. Explore the world beyond traditional print resources through Academic Video Online.


